## Irish Citizen Army Issue

A stamp commemorating the Irish Citizen Army, originally due to issue on January 23, will now issue on April 17. The original stamp was withdrawn due to the emergence of new information regarding the photograph of a man believed to be Captain Jack White, a former British Army Officer who, in 1913, volunteered to train the Irish Citizen Army. This photograph had been published, without challenge, in academic books and periodicals over many years, including the highly regarded publications *History Ireland* and *The Irish Civil War*. However, just ahead of the stamp issue date, a number of historians disputed the veracity of the image saying that the man depicted is not Jack White. Following a review, An Post will now issue a revised stamp showing an image of the Irish Citizen Army at Croydon Park, Dublin.

# CUMANN NA mBAN

“ Celebrating the centenary of the founding of a remarkable movement ”

This year marks the centenary of the founding of Cumann na mBan, a women's organisation set up to facilitate Irish women in playing their role in nationalist activism and An Post is celebrating the event with the issue of a new stamp.

The organisation was formed in Dublin on 2nd April 1914 as an auxiliary of the Irish Volunteers and its principal aim was to help arm the men of the recently formed Volunteers, generate propaganda and present a united Irish opposition to English rule. In its constitution,

it declared that Cumann na mBan would work to 'advance the cause of Irish liberty and to organise Irishwomen in the furtherance of this object', to 'assist in arming and equipping a body of Irish men for the defence of Ireland' and to "form a fund for these purposes, to be called 'The Defence of Ireland Fund'". Within a short time, however, the Cumann na mBan women regarded themselves as 'allies' rather than 'auxiliaries' of the Irish Volunteers.

While its leadership were mainly drawn from among the middle class, the organisation

recruits came from diverse backgrounds.

Notable members of Cumann na mBan included Jennie Wyse Power, Louise Gavan Duffy, Mary and Muriel MacSwiney, Kathleen Clarke, Mabel Fitzgerald (mother of future Irish Taoiseach Garrett Fitzgerald), Elizabeth O'Farrell and Countess Markievicz. Cumann na mBan played a crucial role in the politics of the time. Members were involved in the Easter Rising in 1916 where they worked as Red Cross workers, as couriers and procured rations for the men. They also gathered intelligence on scouting expeditions,

carried despatches and transferred arms from dumps across the city to insurgent strongholds.

This stamp was designed by Ger Garland and features an image of Cumann na mBan members, at the funeral of citizens who had been shot by the British Military during the Howth arms landing in 1914.

# VIKING HERITAGE

“Reflecting Ireland’s significant Viking ancestry”

The Vikings had an enormous influence on the history and development of Ireland. To recognise this fact, An Post will issue two new Viking Heritage stamps on April 24.

The first recorded Viking raids in Irish history occurred in 795 when Vikings, possibly from Norway, attacked and looted the islands of Rathlin off the coast of Antrim and Lambay by Dublin. These early raids interrupted the golden age of Christian Irish culture and began 200 years of intermittent warfare, with waves of Viking raiders plundering monasteries and towns throughout Ireland. The Vikings travelled

all around the coast of Ireland including raids on the Skellig Islands off the coast of County Kerry.

Very importantly for Ireland, the Vikings established ports at Dublin, Waterford, Wexford, Cork and Limerick which are, of course, our biggest port cities today.

However, the Vikings were not favoured by the Irish Celtic Chieftains and things came to a head on Good Friday in 1014 at the Battle of Clontarf. There, Brian Boru, the High King of Munster was opposed by the Vikings from Dublin and the King of Leinster. Viking Chieftain, Brodir, killed King Brian that day and in turn ended the Viking

and Irish Celtic battle. The Vikings held onto power throughout Ireland and they continued to work and trade until the arrival of the Anglo-Normans in 1169.

We know so much about Viking influence in Ireland from the remains of their early settlements which have been found at Wood Quay, Christchurch Place and the Temple Bar area of Dublin. In Wood Quay, the remains of about 200 houses from the 10th and 11th centuries were uncovered. During archaeological investigations in Waterford in 2002, excavations uncovered numerous objects, including silver

ingots, weights and a Viking burial site with weapons.

These commemorative stamps were designed by Ger Garland. One stamp features a sword, similar to those used in the Battle of Clontarf while the second features the Waterford Kite Brooch, Ireland's finest piece of early 12th century secular metalwork.

# EUROPA – 'MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS'

“Ireland’s contribution to this year’s PostEurop issue”

Every year, European Post Offices (PostEurop) select a common theme and each country issues stamps on this topic. This year the theme is ‘National Musical Instruments’.

As many people around the world know, music has always been a very important part of Irish life and our culture. In fact, there are references of Irish music going all the way back to Cú Congalta who was the priest of Lann-Leire, and died in 921BC. Cú Congalta was known as a Tethra (a singer or orator) for voice, personal form, and knowledge.

The harp has become synonymous with Ireland and Irish music with the first unambiguous representation appearing on the Maedoc book-cover in about 1100 AD. It is believed, however, that the harp was widely used by the ruling class long before that.

In fact, Irish musicians travelled throughout Europe in the eighth and ninth centuries and, up to the seventeenth century, harp musicians were patronised by the aristocracy in Ireland. Irish traditional music encompasses many kinds of songs, including ballads and laments which are sung unaccompanied or with

accompaniment by a variety of instruments.

The Irish Bodhrán (drum), on the other hand, is a relatively new instrument, having evolved from the tambourine in the late 18th century. It is a circular, lightweight goatskin drum usually played using a piece of bone or wood called a cipín or with the back of the hand.

The stamps you see here were designed by Design Factory and feature photos of the Irish Harp and the Bodhrán. The Irish Harp featured here was made by leading Irish harp maker John Egan who made more than 2,000 of these instruments throughout his career and

not many are known to still exist.

The Bodhrán on the second stamp actually belonged to noted Irish Wildlife film maker and traditional Irish musician, Éamon de Buítléar.

# HOME RULE ACT – 1914

“100 years after a milestone in Irish history  
– The Home Rule Act”

The Government of Ireland Act 1914, also known as the Home Rule Act, was an Act passed by the Parliament of the United Kingdom and it intended to provide self-government for Ireland.

The background to the Act was that in the period following Catholic emancipation, a powerful Irish party emerged with self-determination as its objective. This self-determination which was really the process of allowing Ireland more say in how it was governed became known as Home Rule.

Members of the Irish Parliamentary Party, including Isaac Butt, Charles Stewart Parnell and John Redmond, kept the issue of Home Rule to the forefront of domestic British politics from 1885 to the start of World War I.

While very important for Ireland, it was also ground-breaking from a British perspective as the Act was the first law ever passed by Parliament that sought to establish devolved government in any part of the United Kingdom.

The stamp itself was designed by Ger Garland

and features images of John Redmond and Edward Carson set against a backdrop of a map of Ireland.

The two people here were central figures in the fight for and against Home Rule: On one side there was John Edward Redmond from County Wexford who was an Irish nationalist politician, barrister, MP in the House of Commons of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and leader of the Irish Parliamentary Party from 1900 to 1918. One of the most formidable people opposing him was Sir Edward Henry Carson (Baron Carson/

Lord Carson), an Irish unionist politician, barrister and judge and leader of the Irish Unionist Alliance and Ulster Unionist Party between 1910 and 1921.

# BLOOM

“Celebrating one of Ireland’s great outdoor events.”

Every year, Ireland’s largest gardening, food and family event, takes place in Dublin’s Phoenix Park. Bloom is organised by Bord Bia, the food board, and it’s held for five days over the June Bank Holiday.

Last year was it’s 7th year and more than 110,000 visitors passed through the gates to explore over 70 acres of exhibitions, stands and events. The Floral Marquee, for example, showcased the very best of plant and floral nurseries in Ireland and was packed with a wonderful selection of floral delights, plants and flowers for sale. Large displays from over 40 of Ireland’s top nurseries and florists

delighted and inspired visitors with the scents of summer.

The Floral competitions are held each year with prizes for the following categories: Large Garden, Medium Garden, Small Garden, Concept Garden, Best Nursery and AOIFA (The Association of Irish Floral Artists) Floral Art.

Some of the most interesting, and popular, exhibitions at Bloom are the garden competitions. Every year professional and gifted amateur garden designers compete to win the gold medal using not much room but plenty of creativity and imagination. Over

# WORLD FLOWER SHOW

For five days in June, the Royal Dublin Society will host the World Association of Flower Arrangers (WAFA) World Flower Show 2014. This is a major event in the international floriculture calendar and an important festival with participants from all 31 member countries including North and South America, South Africa, The Far East, Australia, New Zealand and from all over Europe.

Events include a Flower Arranger's Conference with over 1,200 participants and The World Flower Show, an exhibition of flower arrangements that will be open to the public. This exhibition will showcase the beautiful

and extravagant creations of flower arrangers from all over the world and the RDS is expected to attract over 10,000 visitors per day from all over the world.

The World Flower Show is a triennial event and 2014 is the first year Ireland has been invited to host the event. The theme for the show is 'A Floral Odyssey'. # A COLLECTION WORTHY OF A KING

## “Philately’s royal enthusiast King George V”

As many collectors know, quite a few members of the British royal family have been avid stamp collectors over the years, including the current Head of State Queen Elizabeth II. The first monarch to really make their mark in the area though was King George V who, in his lifetime, put together the finest collection of stamps in the country.

His love of stamps began when his father presented him with his uncle Alfred's (Duke of Edinburgh d.1900) collection. Alfred had been an enthusiastic stamp collector and served as Honorary President of what is now the Royal Philatelic Society London from 1890 until his death.

When George was given Alfred's collection he was immediately hooked and it seems he did not care too much about how he obtained his material - he was known to have raided printer's archives across the world. He once wrote to his philatelic adviser, J. A. Tilleard, "I wish to have the best collection and not one of the best collections in England."

George recognised rarity and made every effort to obtain the rarest stamps at the first possible opportunity. By 1904 he had acquired both the Penny and Two Pence Mauritius 'Post Office' of 1847 - the first stamps issued by a colonial post office and probably the most prized stamps that any collector could wish for.

The penny was bought from the Earl of



Kintore's collection, while the unused Two Pence Mauritius was acquired at auction in 1904 for a then-record price of £1,450.

A courtier asked the Prince if he had seen that "some damned fool had paid as much as 1400 pounds for one stamp". "Yes," came the reply. "I was that damned fool!"

In 1906 he decided to confine his collection almost entirely to the stamps of Great Britain and the Empire. The strength of his collection lies in its completeness. Regardless of how attractive or unattractive the stamps were, King George V never neglected a stamp issue provided that it was of good status.

George V was a collector of many stamp issues.

In fact, he overruled design committees on more than one occasion.

Tradition has it when King George V was in London he spent three afternoons a week with his stamp collection.

His massive collection is a part of the Royal Philatelic Collection today with his stamps mounted in red albums while those of King George VI are in blue albums and boxes and those by the current queen are in green.

It's interesting to note that the British royals were not the only heads of state who collected. Other notable philatelists included King Farouk I of Egypt, Prince Rainier III of Monaco and Franklin D. Roosevelt, U.S. President.
