STAMPA, the National Stamp Exhibition, takes place 16-18 October. This three-day event is a wonderful opportunity to see stamp collecting in action.

With competitive displays, advice on collecting and the main stamp clubs in attendance, it all adds up to an exciting event that's now in its 43rd year. All the latest stamps and many of the earliest, will be on display and available to buy. Linked with the Over 50's Show and the October Coin and Banknote Fair the event promises to be a great focal point for all collectors.

THE FIVE SENSES

“Bringing five human senses to life on stamps.”

How do you capture the genius of the human body's ability to experience the five senses of sight, hearing, taste, smell and touch on a print area of 40mm x 40mm?

On September 10, An Post released The Five Senses issue. An Post's Five Senses Commemorative Stamp Series deliver a visual and interactive experience that combines contemporary design and innovative print techniques.

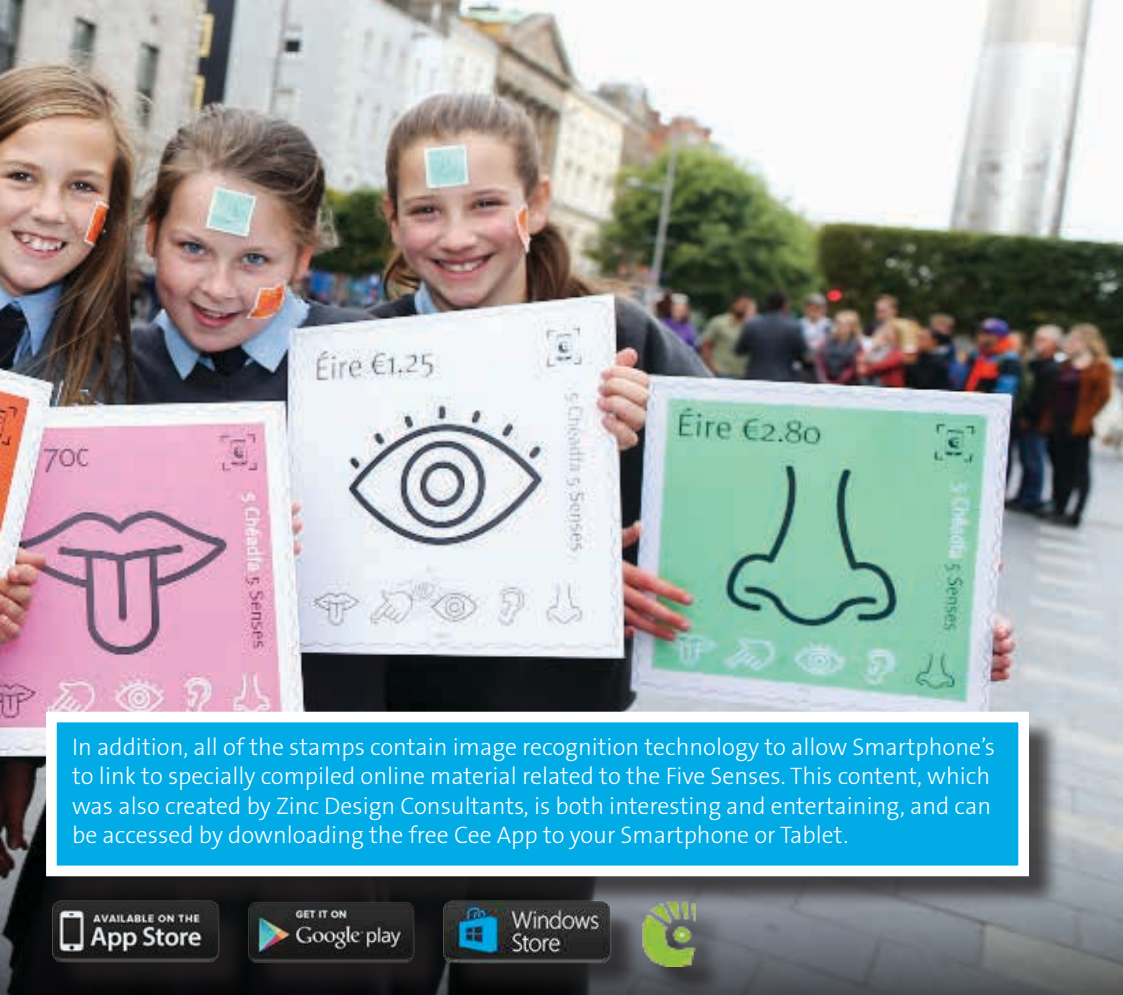
The design approach was to find the simplest way to illustrate and experience complex senses. The design agency ZINC worked

closely with specialist printers Cartor to realise each sense's unique feature. The vibrant colour palette added another dimension, with different colours assigned to each sense.

Print of this unique Stamp Series combines 4 print finishes, 2 paper stocks, embedded smart technology and security features for authentication.

Tickling your taste buds with a strawberry flavoured stamp

A tongue represents taste. Strawberry flavour has been added to the gum used on this pink and black stamp.



In addition, all of the stamps contain image recognition technology to allow Smartphone's to link to specially compiled online material related to the Five Senses. This content, which was also created by Zinc Design Consultants, is both interesting and entertaining, and can be accessed by downloading the free Cee App to your Smartphone or Tablet.

Hotting up with a touch reactive stamp

A hand represents touch. When touched, the thermochromic ink used to print this orange and black stamp causes the hand to change colour from orange to white at 25°C .

Seeing through a transparent stamp

An eye represents sight. Special transparent paper demonstrates the clarity and complexity of sight in this black and grey stamp.

Making noise with small particles embedded in a stamp

An ear represents sound. The thermographic print technique used to print this blue and

black stamp embeds small particles on the paper's surface which make a sound when scratched.

Refreshing mint scented stamp

A nose represents smell. Mint fragrance has been added to the surface of this green and black stamp. When rubbed, mint scented molecules are released into the air.

ST COLUMBAN

“Commemorating the 1400th Anniversary of the death of St Columban.”

On November 23, 2015, many Christian communities right across Europe will celebrate the 1400th anniversary of the death of St Columban who is considered to be one of the most important Irish people of all time. St Columban is sometimes known as St Columbanus, which is the Latinised form of Columban, meaning “white dove”.

He was an Irish missionary who founded several monasteries on the European continent from around AD 590 in the Frankish and Lombard kingdoms, the most famous of which is Luxeuil Abbey in present-

day France and Bobbio Abbey in present-day Italy. He taught a Celtic monastic rule and penitential practices for those repenting of sins, which emphasised private confession to a priest followed by penances in reparation. St Columban is one of the earliest identifiable Hiberno-Latin writers and was known as an exemplar of Irish missionary activity in early medieval Europe.

He was born around AD 543 near the Carlow/Wexford border, received a good classical education and resolved early to embrace an ascetic life. He studied under Sinell of Cleenish in a monastery in County

Fermanagh and then spent over 20 years in a Bangor monastery where he prayed and fasted. After that he travelled throughout Europe before he died in his beloved monastery in Bobbio in AD 615.

Many of his letters and sermons were preserved and these, together with his poems and the rules he composed for his monks, influenced European life and culture well into the Middle Ages. The monastery in Bobbio later became a cultural centre on a par with the famous Benedictine monastery of Monte Cassino, which is also in Italy.

CHRISTMAS 2015

“Celebrating Christmas in Ireland.”

Christmas has always been a very special time in Ireland, particularly for families, and it is still the largest celebration of the year today.

The Christmas period usually starts in early December with Christmas cards and gifts being posted to family and friends living abroad to ensure they arrive in time for the big day. December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception in the Catholic Church became a day when people from rural areas travelled to Dublin to shop for gifts.

Sending and receiving Christmas cards are

both a major part of Christmas for most families and the custom can be traced back to the first ever published Christmas card which appeared in London in 1843. 20 years later they became mainstream with the mass production of cards. The development of colour lithographic printing in the 1930s and the creation of humorous cards in the 1940s and 1950s made the industry what it is today.

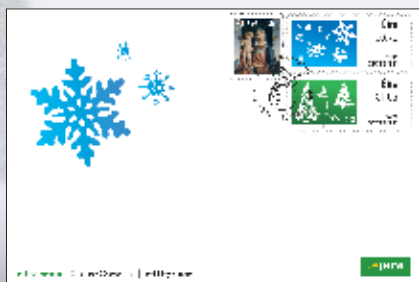
Many households in Ireland will also place a lighted candle in the window of their homes on Christmas Eve. Many people will attend midnight mass in their local churches.

Christmas morning will include a Christmas swim for many and a huge traditional Christmas dinner with turkey and ham.

Christmas celebrations in Ireland are finished on Little Christmas (January 6), with people taking down their Christmas decorations on that day.

Finally, the greeting for "Happy Christmas" in Irish is Nollaig Shona Duit, a literal translation of which is "Christmas, happy, to you".

Founded in 2004 by Frank Warren, PostSecret has generated hundreds of thousands of postcards and nearly a billion online blog views. The postcards here are only a small percentage of the total.

FASCINATING SECRETS

“A new exhibition at the Smithsonian National Postal Museum is simply incredible.”

From now until September 2016, the Smithsonian National Postal Museum in Washington, D.C. has a fascinating exhibition called “PostSecret: The Power of a Postcard”.

It is designed as, in the organiser’s words, “a contemporary narrative of mail and the postal service, highlighting the aesthetics of postcards and the juxtaposition between anonymity and shared experiences.”

In reality it is an exhibition of more than 500,000 postcards from around the world, each with an interesting, or sometimes shocking, secret. The cards come from

PostSecret which is an ongoing community art project where people mail in their never-before-told secrets anonymously on a postcard.

Since 2004, artist Frank Warren has collected the postcards and has posted a weekly selection of them on the PostSecret website. He has even published six books of postcard collections.

So where did it all begin? Warren had the original idea and initially handed out postcards to strangers less than a mile from the National Postal Museum. He also left them in public



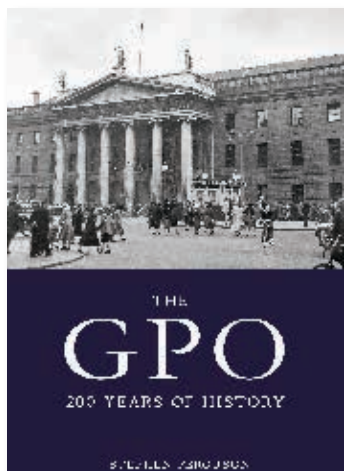
places, asking people to share a secret. He asked only that the secret had to be absolutely true and it had never been shared before.

The postcards on display here make compelling reading: Here are people's regrets, fears, betrayals, desires, confessions, childhood humiliations and other stories laid bare for all to see. Some are regular postcards, others are artfully decorated and customised in stark contrast to the secrets they contain about everything from taboos to hidden acts of kindness and shocking habits. The whole idea of PostSecret has proved popular, with more than 500,000 postcards received to date and

over 700 million visits to the PostSecret blog. To show visitors the magnitude and popularity of the project the exhibition contains a pyramid of more than 250,000 stacked postcards.

"Our hope is that visitors will be inspired to think about other people's secrets - and their own - as invitations for empathy, understanding and connection," said Sharon Klotz, exhibition director at the museum.

Previous exhibition venues have included the Museum of Modern Art in New York City and The Baltimore Visionary Museum.



'The GPO - 200 Years of History'

In this beautifully produced and illustrated book, Stephen Ferguson, who is Assistant Secretary of An Post, tells the story of the GPO and the people who have played an integral part in its history over the centuries.

Designed by Francis Johnston, Dublin's iconic GPO has been the communications hub of Ireland for 200 years. Famous as the headquarters of the men and women of the 1916 Rising, the building has witnessed not only great events but many ordinary personal stories as well.

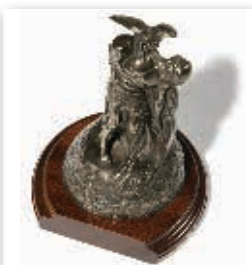
