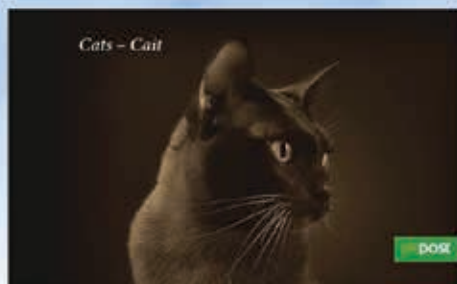

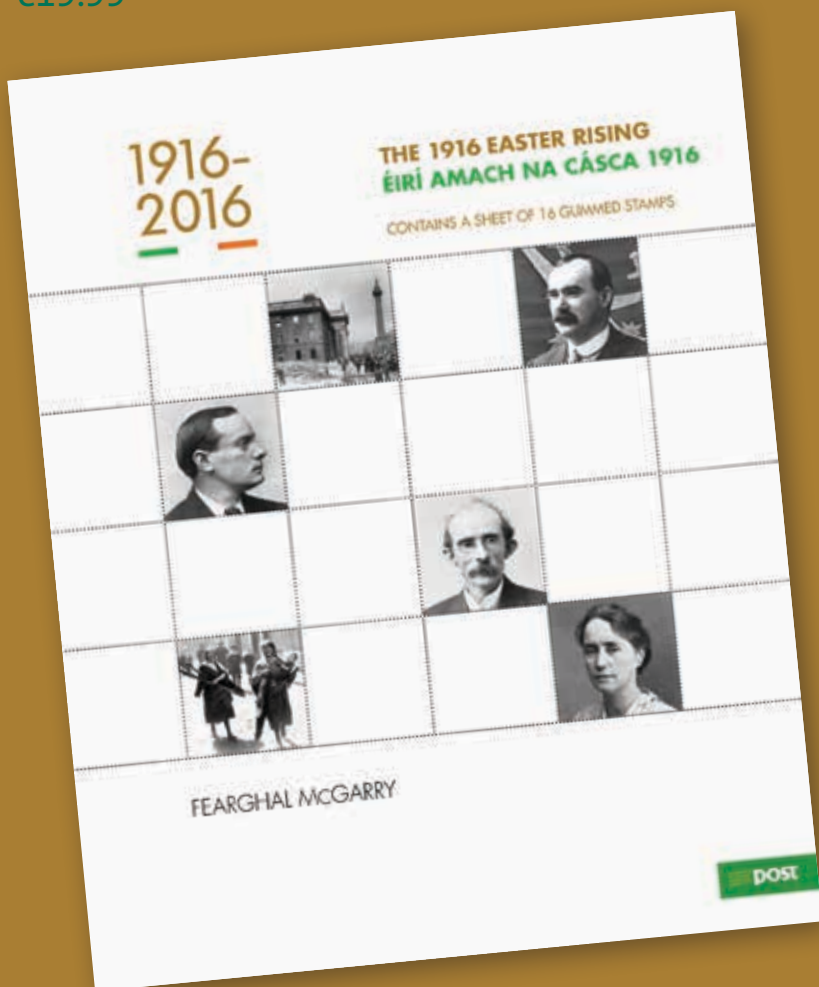

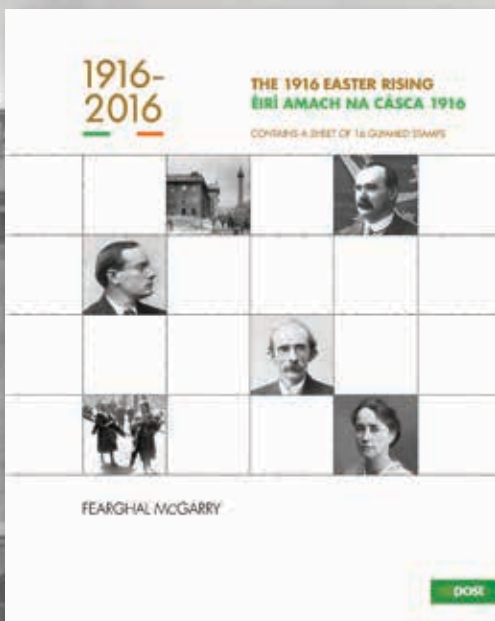

1916 - 2016

“Commemorating the Centenary of the Easter Rising.”

100 years ago, on Easter Monday in 1916, the world witnessed the defining moment for the Republic of Ireland: The Easter Rising as it is known, involved about 1,000 members of the Irish Republican Brotherhood, Irish Volunteers, Irish Citizen Army and Cumann na mBan (The Irishwomen's Council) who occupied key buildings and strategic points in Dublin before proclaiming an Irish Republic for the very first time.

This rebellion against British rule came right in the middle of World War One and ended within six violent days. It was put

down, brutally, by the British Army and it left approximately 500 dead with much of the city-centre in ruins. 16 of the rebel leaders were executed and over 3,000 suspects were arrested.

The focus of the rebellion was at the General Post Office (GPO) in Dublin where most of the leaders were stationed. In fact, the Proclamation was read on the steps of the building which was subsequently shelled by a British gunboat and almost completely destroyed. People believe that bullet holes can still be seen today in the colonnade at

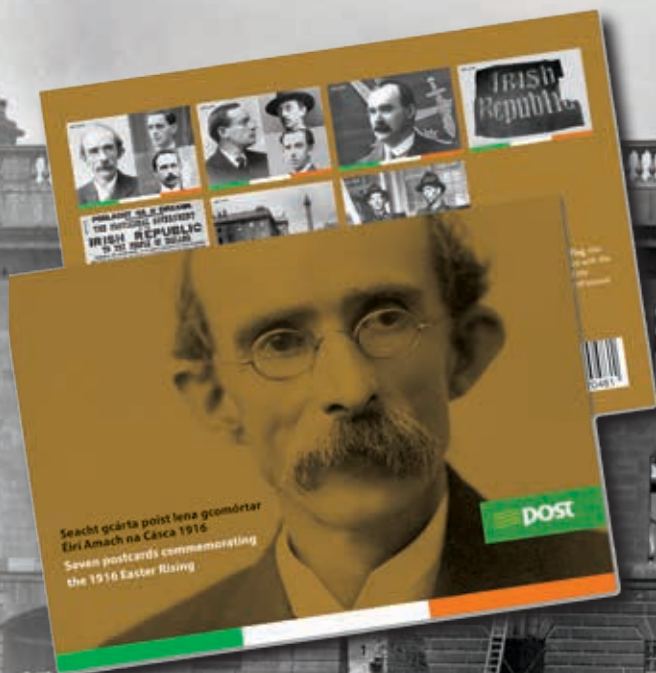
the front of the building.

Militarily the Easter Rising was a failure but in many other ways it was a success. It transformed Ireland by bringing about popular support for an Independent Irish Republic and it also brought world attention to the struggle for independence.

Earlier this year An Post issued new stamps on the Stamps on a Roll (SOAR) system that will be available throughout 2016 from the Philatelic Bureau and Post Offices nationwide. The stamps were designed by Dublin-based Zinc Design Consultants.

You can buy these stamps at Post Offices in the stamps on a roll format (SOAR) or as a special souvenir sheet of 16 gummed stamps which are available at irishstamps.ie or from the Philatelic Bureau or Counters 20 & 21 in the GPO.

Or you can choose a souvenir folder which contains all 16 gummed stamps with descriptions and a timeline of important events in the period from the lead-up to the rebellion through to 1921.

To complement the SOAR stamps, a superb range of additional product was produced for the 1916 - 2016 issue. This includes a beautiful sheetlet of 16 gummed stamps and a set of seven postcards (now available) and a Souvenir Folder which includes the 16 stamp gummed sheet, and a Presentation Folder containing four miniature sheets.

There are four miniature sheets available in a Presentation Folder. This is a beautiful tri-fold folder, housed in a micron envelope, featuring a large-scale reproduction of the Proclamation and a historical narrative. The

souvenir miniature sheets are cellophane wrapped and each features four stamps from the categories: ‘Leaders and Icons’, ‘Participants’, ‘Easter Week’ and ‘The Aftermath’.

An Post has commissioned an illustrated book which is destined to become highly collectable. Written by eminent historian Fearghal McGarry, a reader in Modern Irish History at the School of History and Anthropology at Queen’s University Belfast. It draws on eye-witness accounts to assess this key turning-point in modern Irish history

as McGarry explores the impact of events at the General Post Office, as well as setting the rebellion in its wider historical context. In addition, it contains the special souvenir sheet of 16 gummed stamps.

An Post has issued a set of seven commemorative postcards shrink wrapped in cellophane to purchase.

Individually, or collectively, these stamps, souvenir folders, postcards and book add significantly to an Irish national commemorative programme, 100 years after the Easter Rising. It's a very important

celebration of the most significant event in the birth of the nation and is particularly relevant to An Post as the GPO was the focal point for the rebellion over those six days in 1916.



BICENTENARY OF THE BIRTH OF CHARLES GAVAN DUFFY

“Honouring the anniversary of the birth
of a great patriot.”

Charles Gavan Duffy was born in Monaghan on 12 April, 1816. The son of a Catholic shopkeeper, his parents died when he was very young and he was raised by his uncle, Father James Duffy, the Parish Priest of Castleblayney. While studying law in Dublin in 1842, Duffy, along with John Blake Dillon and Thomas Davis, founded *The Nation*, a weekly journal of Irish nationalist opinion. All three were members of Daniel O’Connell’s Repeal Association, which would become known as the Young Ireland movement.

The association campaigned for the repeal of the Act of Union of 1800 between Great Britain and Ireland.

He was imprisoned for sedition in 1844 and again in 1848.

On the 6th August, 1849 he formed the Tenant Right League. In 1852 he was elected to Parliament for New Ross, County Wexford and organised an independent opposition of some 50 Irish members to obstruct any government that did not support the demands of the league.

His tactics foreshadowed those of Charles Stewart Parnell, but Duffy's efforts were frustrated by factionalism and by lack of support from the Irish clergy, who thought him too radical. Disillusioned with Irish politics following the collapse of the Independent Irish Party, Duffy retired from Irish politics in 1855, and went to Australia. There he was elected to the Victoria House of Assembly in 1856, he served as prime minister of Victoria in 1871-72 and was knighted in 1873.

He died on 9 February, 1903 in Nice.

The stamp, designed by Steve Simpson, is based on an illustration of Charles Gavan Duffy by Charles Cullen. Cullen was born in Longford and was a founding member of the Project Arts Centre in 1966. He taught at the National College of Art & Design and is a prolific artist.

ECOLOGY IN EUROPE "THINK GREEN"

“New Europa stamps issued.”

Every year, European Post Offices (PostEurop) selects a common theme to celebrate and then each country issues stamps on this topic: One is a national stamp and the other a Europe-wide design chosen in a competition amongst members.

In 2016, the theme is Ecology in Europe “Think Green” and PostEurop held its design competition amongst member countries based on this theme. A total of 24 entries were received from designers chosen by each of the postal services and then 216 confidential votes were received from

PostEurop members whose designs were anonymously published. In the end the design from Cyprus Post emerged as the winner. Second place went to Posta Slovenije and in third place, Magyar Posta.

The winning stamp is the work of Ms. Doxia Sergidou who explained that “the main purpose was to show that it is in our hand to create a greener planet. Thus, I have placed a hand on the top side of the stamp which basically represents anyone of us, actively replacing the grey colour (the environmental pollution) with the green colour which

symbolizes environmental living and hope, and in turn inspire us for a better world. The left side of the stamp represents the polluted side and is painted grey showing us the tremendous disaster caused by the industries, automotive vehicles, power generation and inefficient waste.”

Ms. Sergidou’s winning design appears on the 70c stamp. The €1.05 stamp was designed by Red Dog Design. This design is a contemporary representation of Ireland’s “forty shades of green”.

CENTENARY OF THE BATTLE OF THE SOMME

“Remembering the 3,500 Irish soldiers
who gave their lives.”

The Battle of the Somme took place near the Somme River in France and lasted from 1 July to 18 November, 1916. It was conceived as a joint Anglo-French advance which would break the German lines and open the road to Berlin. Poorly planned, poorly researched and poorly executed what ensued was the biggest blood bath in the history of the British Army.

The Allies had hoped that the Somme offensive would be a major victory that would bring the carnage of the First World War to an end, but by the time it ended, more than

one million soldiers from both sides had died without making any significant alteration in the opening position.

Among the dead were over 3,500 Irish soldiers, with many more wounded, all mostly on the very first day. One of the most shocking facts is that the 5,500 casualties of the 36th Ulster Division on 1 July were men drawn almost entirely from one community in Ulster.

In a continuation of the same battle, the 16th Irish Division had 4,330 casualties in

September, of whom 1,200 were killed. These came mainly from the other three provinces.

It is difficult to calculate exactly how many Irish soldiers died in the Battle of the Somme as many men had joined different regiments, but what is known is that when they went “over the top”, their deaths affected communities in every part of Ireland.

The stamp was designed by Dublin designers Red&Grey Design and it features an image of the Royal Irish Rifles from the Imperial War Museum.

IRELAND'S FIRST OFFICIAL POSTAGE STAMPS

“The first postage stamps issued by the Republic of Ireland appeared in 1922.”

The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland issued the world's first postage stamps in 1840. At the time Ireland was a part of the UK and so British stamps were used here too.

However, in 1922, Ireland won her independence and one of the first expressions of the new free state of the Republic of Ireland was the issuing of our own postage stamps.

But before the new stamps were ready, and to show the world that the new Irish state was indeed a separate entity, existing British stamps were overprinted with Irish text. These definitives appeared from 17 February

1922 and were used until separate Irish issues became available later in the year. They were overprinted by with the words “Rialtas Sealadac na héireann 1922” (Provisional Government of Ireland 1922) in grey-black.

At the time of the 1922 creation of the Irish Republic, there was a stamp design competition with the big printers and some unrecorded organisations competing for the contract. The Government Printers, based in Dublin Castle, eventually produced the first set of definitive stamps for the new state.



The state set up a new Department of Posts and Telegraphs (or the P&T as it was known) and it produced a regular series of definitive stamps using domestic Irish designs. The new stamps were issued on 6 December 1922 and the first was a 2d stamp, depicting a map of Ireland.

These first stamps were designed for everyday use. In 1929 the first commemorative stamps were issued and these now appear several times a year, celebrating many aspects of Irish life, including notable events and anniversaries, Irish life, culture and famous people.

Oifig an Phoist, the Irish Post Office, was the section of the Department of Posts and Telegraphs which issued all Irish stamps up to 1984. At that point the department divided into two semi-state organisations and the new postal body, An Post, took over the responsibility for all Irish postal services including issuing postage stamps.

World War 1 – Gallipoli:

Issue Date: 23 April, 2015

Expiry Date: 23 April, 2016

In memory of the Irish regiments in World War I, An Post issued two stamps. 100 years ago, in February/March 1915, the Allied Powers in World War I began what became known as the Gallipoli Campaign. The stamps were designed by Vermillion Design. The 68c stamp shows Irish soldiers in a trench at Gallipoli. The second stamp, the €1 value, features an image of the SS River Clyde.



Centenary of the Sinking of RMS Lusitania:

Issue Date: 7 May, 2015

Expiry Date: 7 May, 2016

Two stamps were issued to mark 100 years since the sinking of the liner off the Irish Coast. These two stamps marked the centenary of the sinking of the RMS Lusitania. The 68c stamp portrays an image of the Lusitania just before the torpedo hit, steaming along in relatively calm waters in fine weather. However, the €1 stamp shows the ship listing to one side after the torpedo strike and explosion which led to her sinking within 18 minutes.



Europa - Old Toys:

Issue Date: 14 May, 2015

Expiry Date: 14 May, 2016

To celebrate the 2015 Europa theme – Old Toys, An Post issued two stamps. The 2015 Europa issue from An Post celebrates the theme of Old Toys with two stamps, the 68c stamp features a painting of a toy truck and the €1 stamp features a painting of an old teddy bear. The stamps were designed by leading Dublin design firm Design Factory and are based on paintings by Cornhghall Casey.



50th Anniversary of Mountain Rescue Ireland:

Issue Date: 4 June, 2015

Expiry Date: 4 June, 2016

To mark the 50th anniversary of the founding of Mountain Rescue Ireland, An Post issued two stamps. Before 1965 there was no organised mountain rescue service in Ireland. That all changed in November 1965 when Mountain Rescue Ireland was founded at a meeting of mountaineering and hill-walking clubs. These stamps mark the 50th anniversary of the founding of Mountain Rescue Ireland. They were designed by Conor & David and feature members assisting climbers who have gotten into difficulties. We are proud to bring you two of these unique stamps, with values of 68c and €1.



150th Anniversary of the birth of WB Yeats:

Issue Date: 11 June, 2015

Expiry Date: 11 June, 2016

To mark the 150th of the birth of the great poet WB Yeats, An Post issued a stamp based on an iconic photograph of WB Yeats from The National Portrait Gallery, London, by photographer George C. Beresford. This stamp was designed by Detail Design and is a famous image and familiar to poetry students worldwide and presents the poet's name and dates.
